ISSUE TITLE: Format Corner and Range Clarification for IBIS-AMI
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DATE ACCEPTED BY IBIS OPEN FORUM:

STATEMENT OF THE ISSUE:

The IBIS 5.0 specification is very vague on pg. 140 and 141 with the description of the various Format types, especially Corner. The rules on how Corner is expected to work with the simulator's corner setting is unclear and needs explanation.

In addition, the definition on pg. 140 shows three values for Corner: Corner <typ value> <slow value> <fast value>, while on pg. 147 the definition of Rx_Receiver_Sensitivity only shows two values: (Format Corner <slow> <fast>). This inconsistency cannot be resolved by an EDA tool without additional information which is not available.

STATEMENT OF THE RESOLVED SPECIFICATIONS:

On pg. 140 replace these lines:

ANALYSIS PATH/DATA THAT LED TO SPECIFICATION:

It was determined in the May 17, 2011 IBIS ATM teleconference that the example on pg. 147 was clearly a typo. BIRD 127.1 was issued to incorporate the correction for that oversight.

The changes documented in BIRD 140 are also based on the discussions which took place in the IBIS ATM teleconference and subsequent emails.

There was an extensive discussion in IBIS ATM teleconferences and emails about the problem that the IBIS specification deliberately leaves "fast" and "slow" undefined (see discussion on C_comp in Section 9, Notes on Data Derivation Method). These discussions concluded (on June 21, 2011 in the ATM teleconference) that until the analog modeling in IBIS solves this ambiguity, the method of

associating the AMI Format Corner with the analog model corners will be left to the EDA tool vendors.

On the request of the IBIS Open Forum this BIRD was returned in the month of August 2011 to the ATM Task Group for further discussion. Following the discussion in the August 30, 2011 ATM teleconference, Walter Katz and Arpad Muranyi drafted a language in a private phone conversation with private emails following that. BIRD 140.2 is the result of that work. These discussions addressed the related issues found in BIRD 124, and the verbiage in the "ANY OTHER BACKGROUND INFORMATION" below is a forward looking solution to address those problems.

ANY OTHER BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

When BIRD 124 for Dependency Table is finalized, the following text may be considered to be added after the "Example" in the above notes:
